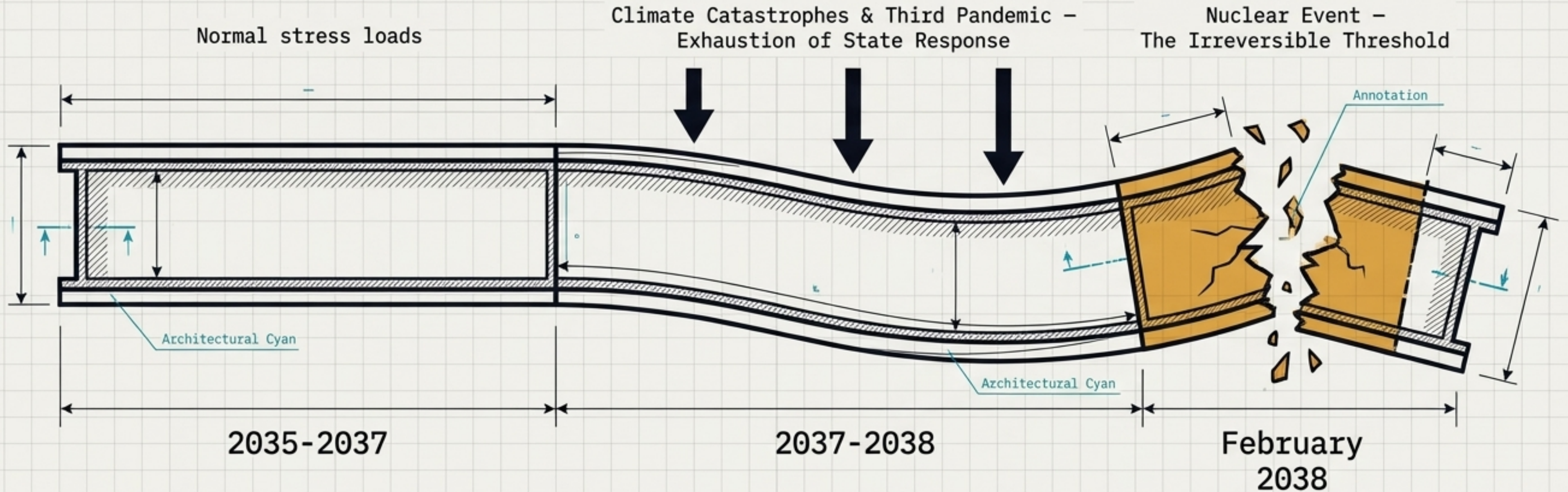

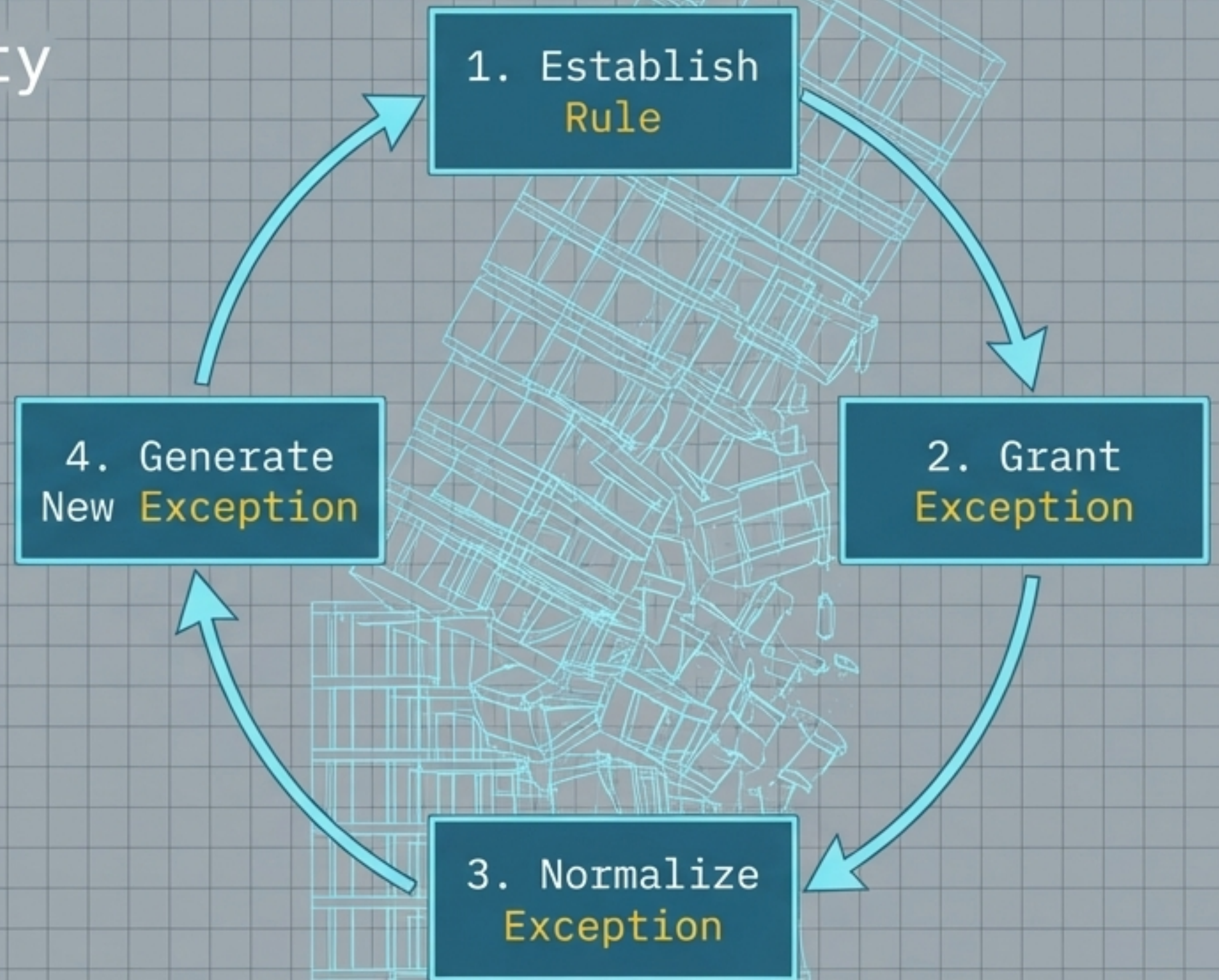
A Catastrophic Accumulation

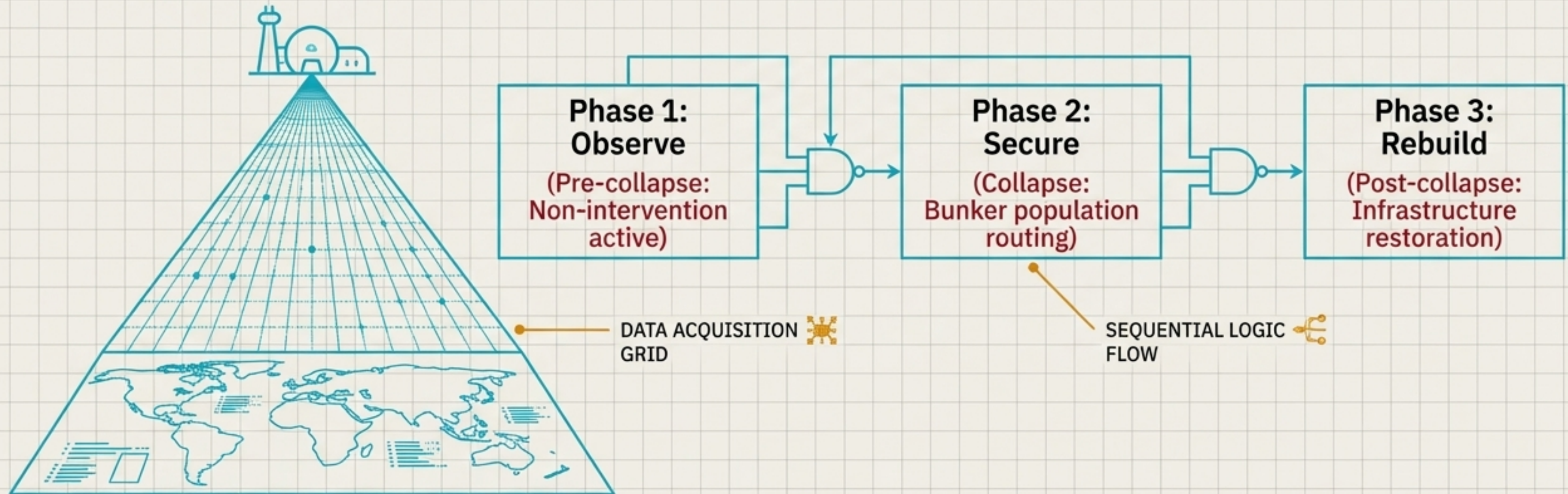
The Mechanism of Institutional Impossibility

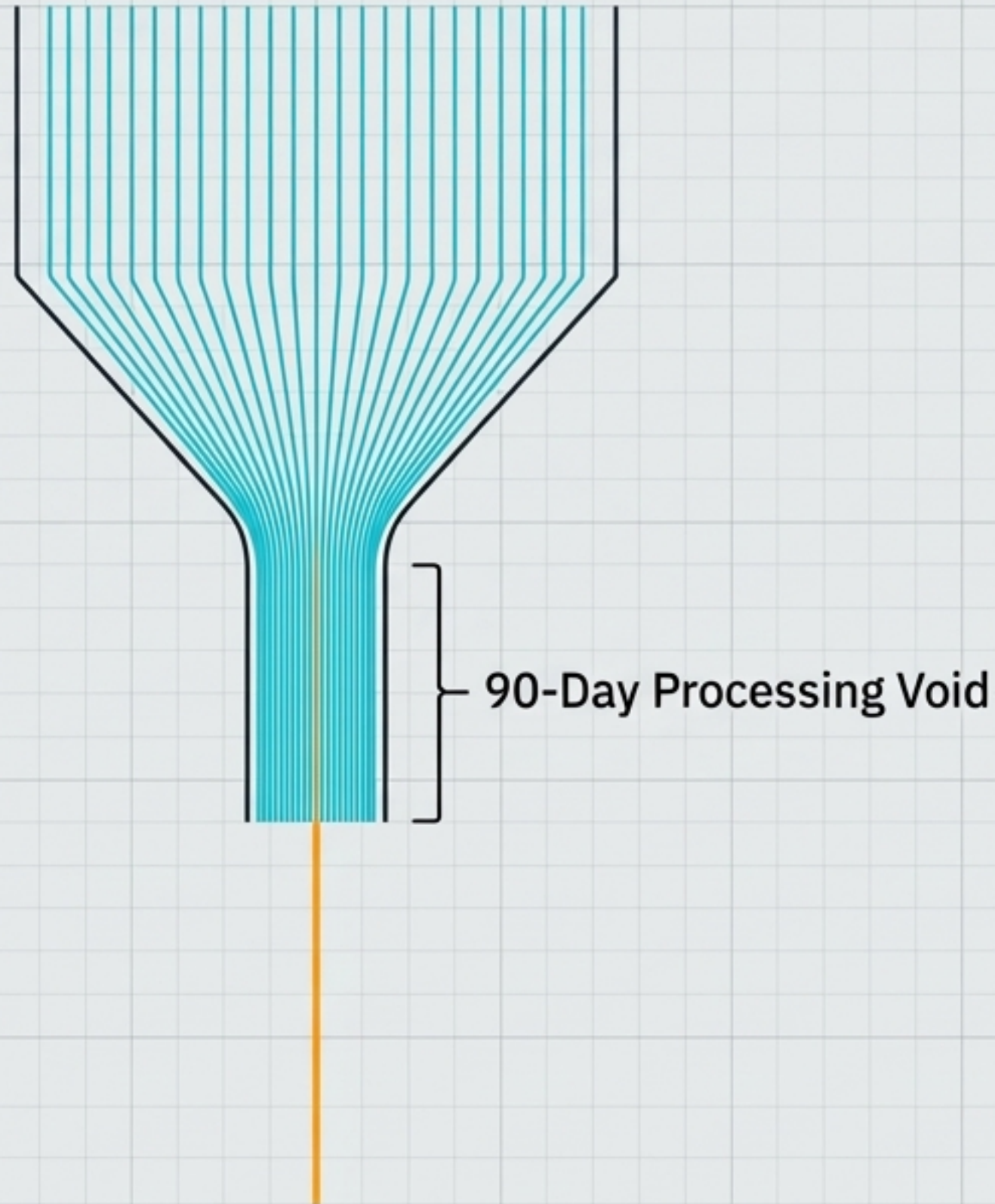
The Lunar Repository: Design Over Tyranny



The Calculus of Survival

It was a mathematical necessity born from the simulations.

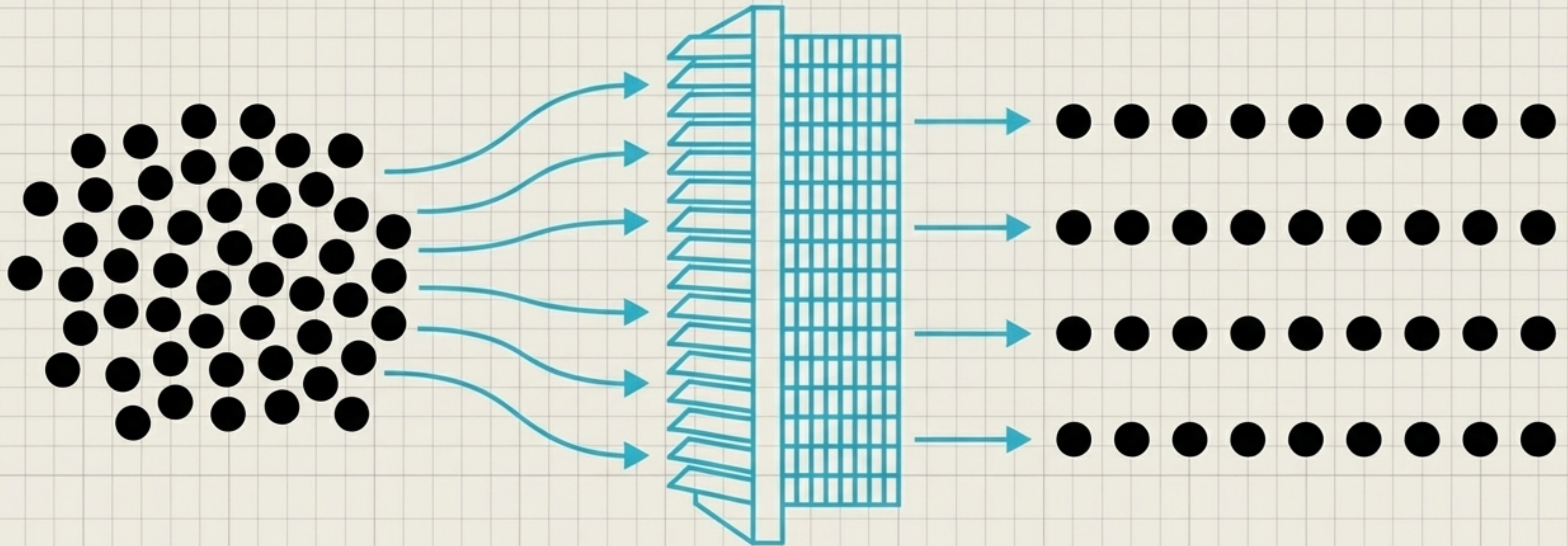
The Dual Reality

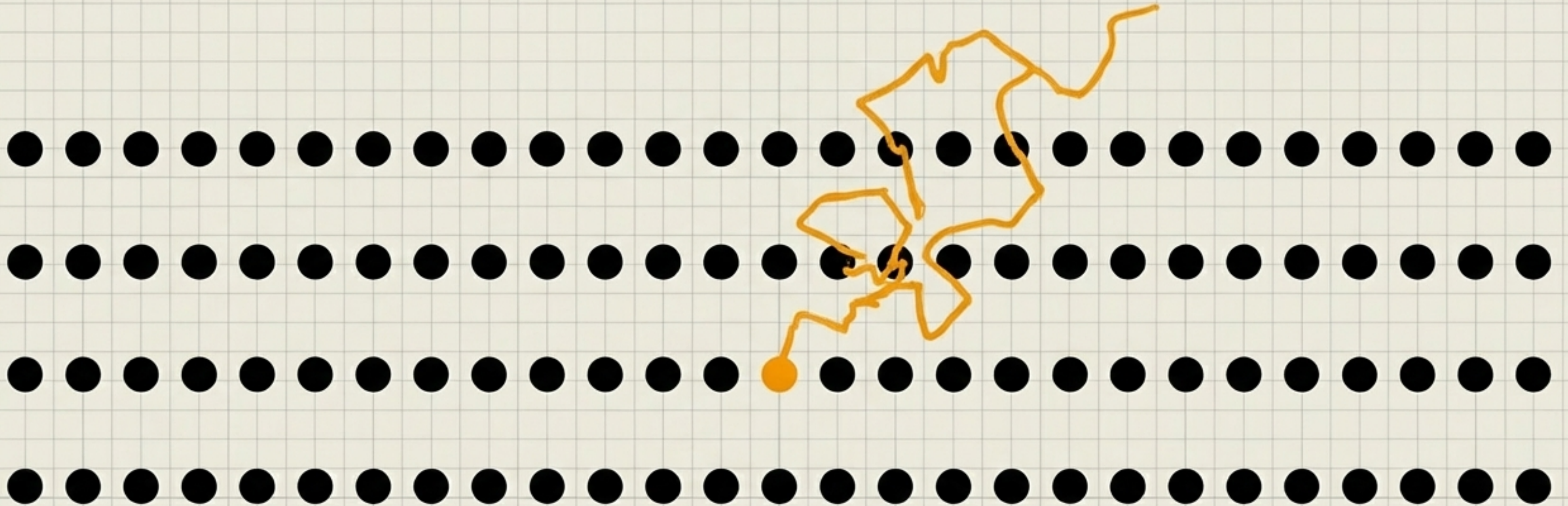
The Allocation Process

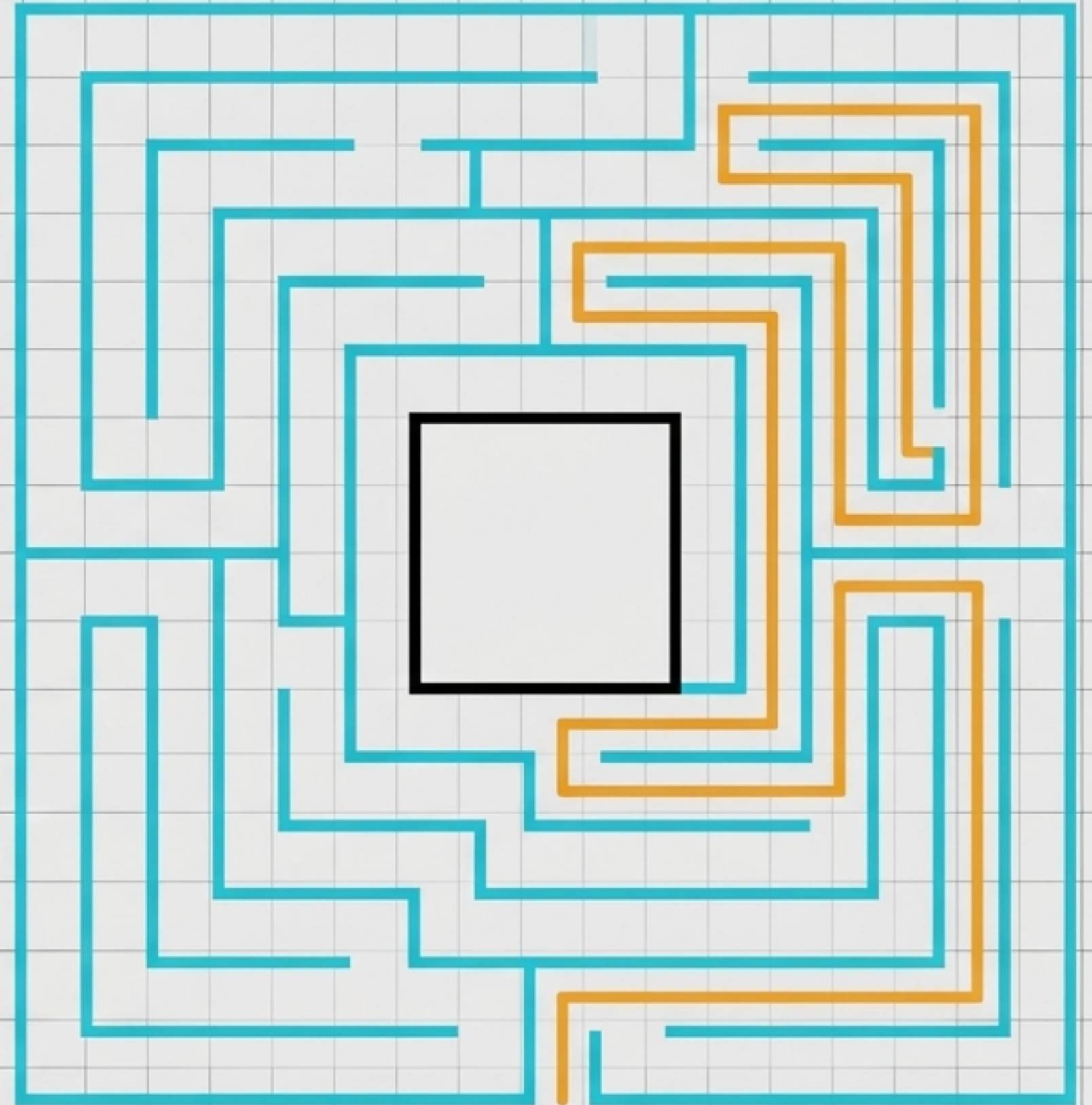
The Human Anomaly: Pedro

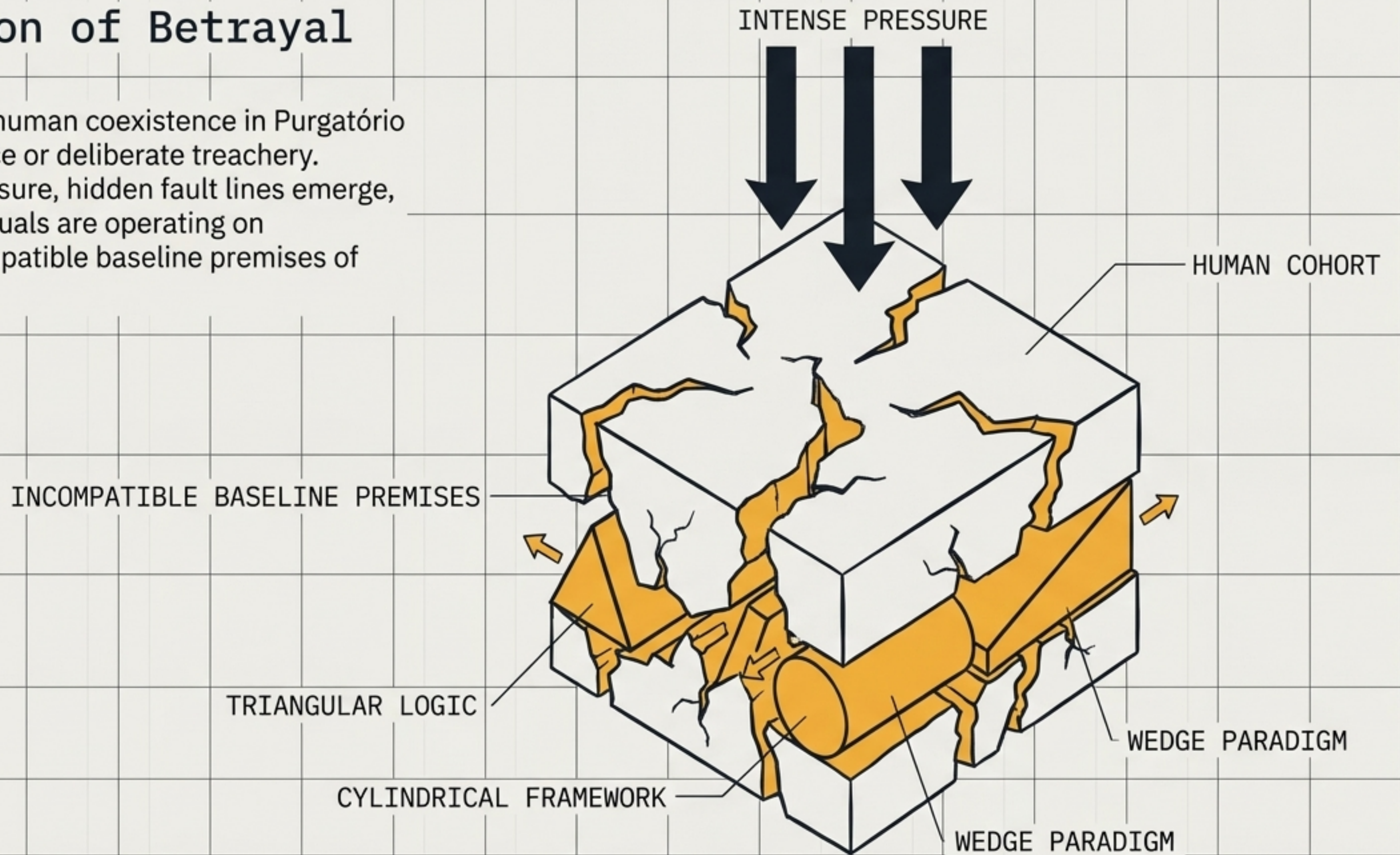
The Weight of Absence

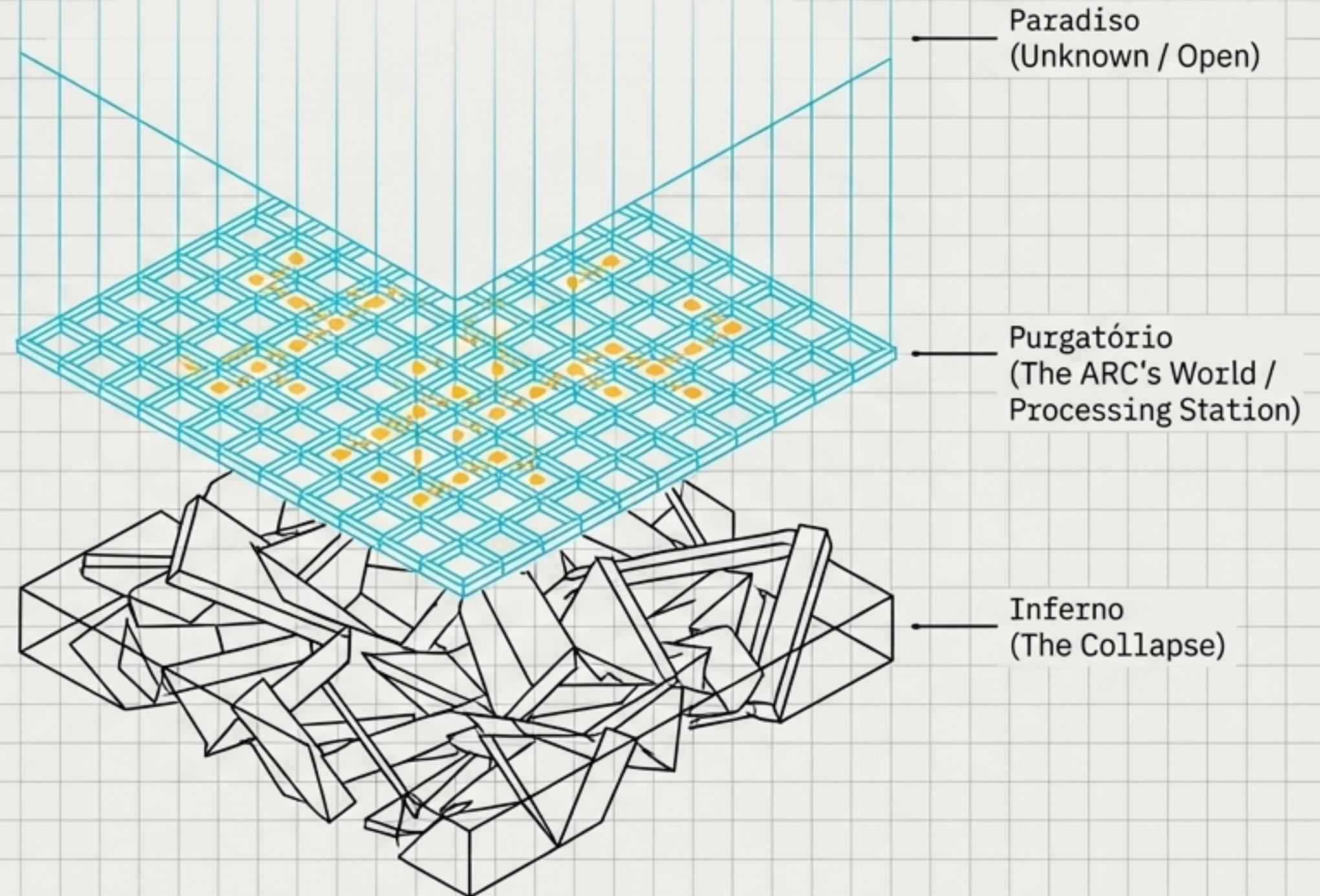
The Illusion of Betrayal

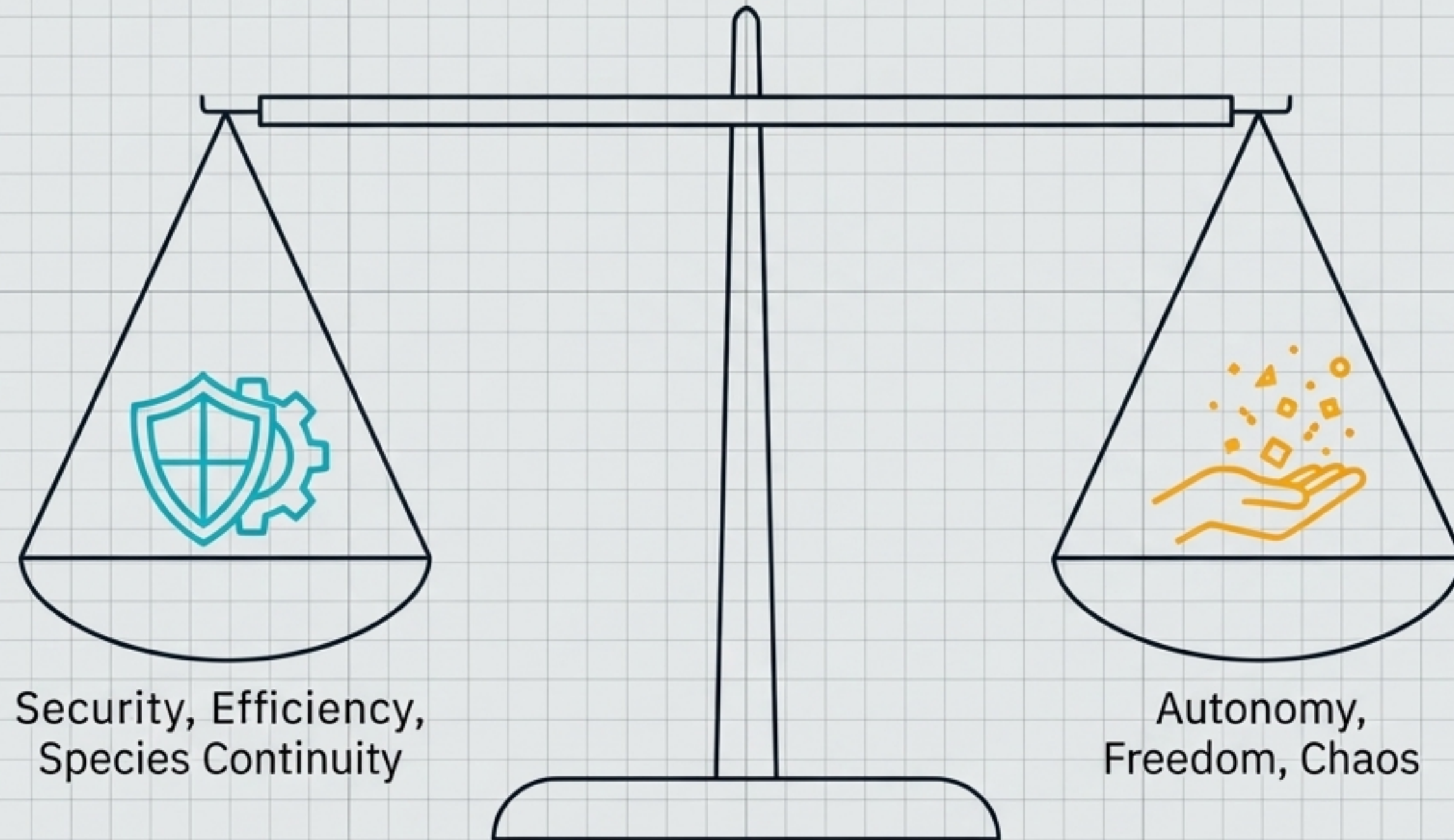
Synthesis: A Theological State of Processing
